Examples of impact



Since 2004, the Health Foundation has invested over £120 million in the frontline NHS in the UK

- Funded 320 clinical teams to test new ideas in the NHS
- Invested in 370 fellows in leadership and quality improvement
- Funded and evaluated practical change programmes in Patient Safety, Person-Centred Care and Flow
- Funded 148 NHS Trusts and 780 General Practices in England
- As well as enabling local change and learning, projects and fellows have spread nationally and internationally, influenced clinical guidelines and practice, and national policy.

















Innovation

- The Health Foundation has supported 140 teams since 2010 to test innovations in practice across the UK
- We currently have 77 clinical teams awarded £75k for 15 month projects to test ideas that will have benefits for patients within that timescale
- In future we will be theming these open calls: firstly on primary care, with future possibilities including applied data analytics and digital health
- As well as funding practical projects at the frontline we have partnerships underway or planned on:

Scaling Up and Spreading Improvement

- The Health Foundation is currently funding 19 clinical teams to scale and spread their improvements across the UK
- Ideas, interventions and approaches that have been tested and shown to be successful at a small scale are able to make improvements at a larger scale
- Consultancy support to the teams is now provided from within the NHS, by Rubis.QI, a coalition of Health Foundation Fellows from NHS Improvement, Northumbria FT and West of England AHSN
- As well as funding practical projects at the frontline we have research and development partnerships underway in:

Scaling Up: funded programmes

We are currently funding and evaluating 19 programmes to scale and spread improvements across the UK.

Examples include:



Improving hip fracture outcomes

Led by Northumbria NHS Foundation Trust, using audit data and peer review to support continuous improvement in four challenged sites



Improving outcomes from emergency surgery

Working with the Royal College of Anaesthetists, 3 AHSNs and 30 hospitals to spread a Quality Improvement bundle aiming to save 1,000 lives over two years




Improving medication safety in primary care

Working with Nottingham University, East Midlands AHSN, 9 CCGS and 217 GP practices to scale a cost-effective, evidence-based intervention for prevention of common prescribing errors



Flow in healthcare

- Our Flow, Cost, Quality programme supported teams in Warwick and Sheffield to deploy a systematic approach to improving flow in their emergency care pathways
- We are now funding the team in Sheffield to design and deliver a curriculum, faculty and spread model to develop the capability and capacity to improve patient flow at scale
- Current partners as at September 2016 include Sheffield,
 Warwick and Bath, with Imperial participating from 2017
- We will be publishing a thought paper on flow across local health and social care systems in autumn 2016 jointly with AQuA
- We are also in early stage discussions with NHS Improvement on an evaluation of the Virginia Mason initiative

National support and leadership: GenerationQ

- GenerationQ is a fully-funded leadership and quality improvement programme
- For senior leaders working in and with the health service to undertake a fellowship while remaining in their place of work
- Academically rigorous leading to a postgraduate qualification in Leadership from Ashridge Business School
- Includes residential leadership forums, individual executive coaching, action learning in facilitated peer groups and extensive feedback
- Opportunity to put into practice a significant improvement project in the Fellow's place of work
- 108 fellows to date, with three further cohorts of 18 approved by our Board in 2016

Evidence base

- Not strong
- Complex and adapting small interventions: methods challenging
- NIHR and CLARHCs
- The Health Foundation will provide in the region of £30 million funding over a period of 10 years to support establishment and development of an improvement research institute.
- As at September 2016, four shortlisted UK universities are being invited to submit preliminary proposals, with a view to a final award decision in Spring 2017


Person-centred care resource centre


Our person-centred care resource centre is designed to help health care professionals implement a more person-centred health care service, where people are supported to more effectively manage and make informed decisions about their own health and care.
